BTTM Students Field Trip to Fambong Lho Wildlife Sanctuary

The ICFAI University Sikkim organized a field trip for BTTM students on Saturday 27th April 2019 to Fambong Lho Wildlife Sanctuary, East Sikkim. Tourism is essentially an 'outdoor' subject per se, therefore the field was organized to complement the classroom lectures. End of the trip students have come up with their findings as well as pros and cons they have found and/or experienced. As a result the trip has made them experienced in practical sense to how a trip of similar nature could be designed and conducted in future and most importantly how to make it through despite all difficulties and to keep the spirit high which is a very important aspect of any tourism endeavor.
